School Board Powers and Duties - 150

Policy Writing and Revisions (151)

The Board of Education provides leadership for student achievement by authorizing the Superintendent of Schools to constantly appraise and review all Board Policies. It is the Board of Education's responsibility to make sure written policies are established that:

- 1) Reinforce and support the school district's vision and mission statements.
- 2) Clearly state what the school district is to accomplish.
- 3) Clearly state the parameters within which the district's work is to occur and what it will not tolerate.
- 4) Lay out for the board the work it chooses to do and how it chooses to do the work.
- 5) Clearly state how the board will work with the Superintendent of Schools and staff and delegate authority and responsibilities.

Any change or addition of board policy must be done at a legal board meeting with a majority of the Board of Education voting for the change or addition. A new writing or change of any board policy must be presented to the Board of Education 72 hours in advance of any meeting where the board will vote on the new policy or change in policy.
