Summer School - 351

The Norwalk-Ontario-Wilton School District shall offer a summer school courses for students in grades 4K through grade 6. The purpose of summer school shall be for the enrichment, maintenance of skill and remedial help.

All children residing within the district during the summer session shall be considered resident students of the district for summer school purposes. Open enrolled students to the Norwalk-Ontario-Wilton School District will also be allowed to participate in summer school classes. Summer school will be provided without cost to individual parents of summer school students. If determined practical by administration, all students will receive a free daily breakfast prior to summer school classes starting.

All summer school courses will be taught by DPI licensed teachers. Courses offered will be related to or be similar to instruction that is offered during the regular school year. The Elementary Principal is directly in charge of the annual development and organization of the summer school program. The Board of Education must annually approve the courses taught during summer school.

Norwalk-Ontario-Wilton School District employed teachers will have the first opportunity to teach summer school. If there are not enough NOW employed teachers willing to teach summer school, the Elementary Principal may locate and hire DPI licensed teachers who are not employees of the school district during the regular school year.

Attendance of students in summer school shall be strictly voluntary. Students enrolling in summer school shall, however, be expected to attend on a daily basis.

The Norwalk-Ontario-Wilton School District will provide transportation to and from summer school classes

Summer school shall be operated in accordance with state aid provisions outlined in state statutes referenced below.
